

The Mora Area Fire Department, founded in 1904, serves the cities of Mora and Quamba along with all or parts of the nine following townships; Arthur, Brunswick, Comfort, Grass Lake, Hillman, Knife Lake, Peace, Pomroy and Whited.

The mission of the Mora Area Fire Department is to minimize loss of life and property from fires, natural disasters, life threatening situations and to assist other emergency agencies.

We strive to be known as an innovative and progressive fire department. Our members are dedicated to the delivery of effective fire suppression, rescue services and quality fire safety education to the public at a reasonable cost.

There were 27 firefighters serving on the department in 2008 with experience levels ranging from one + years to over 30 years.

In 2008, the department added an air compressor and filling station to be used for the re-filling of air bottles on our Self-contained Breathing Packs. These packs are worn by the firefighters in the hazardous atmospheric conditions found at many fires. Funds for the equipment came from donations and grants received by the department.

Fire department members volunteer their time to help with fire prevention activities in the community. Numerous groups are given tours of the fire station. Firefighters visit school classrooms and daycare sites to teach children about fire safety. The department has taken part in community events like the safety fair at Corborn's, "Night out" in the Library Park and helping with events at the county fair. Members also help various businesses in our area with fire extinguisher training and fire prevention talks. Last December, members also helped with bell ringing for the Salvation Army.

Members of the fire department are also members of the Mora Area Fire Department Relief Association. The relief association's primary responsibility is to watch over the firefighters retirement funds. They also do fundraising activities to provide for non-budgeted items needed by the fire department. Each year the association holds a chili feed during fire prevention week. This brings area residents to the fire station, not only to eat, but also to view the firefighting equipment, visit with the firefighters and take home some fire prevention materials. Other association fundraisers include the annual fire prevention calendar and the aluminum can drop-off bin located across from the fire station. Proceeds from these fundraisers have been used to purchase fire prevention materials for distribution to area residents and school children. In 2008, some of the funds raised helped purchase new flashlights, portable radios and fitness equipment for the firefighters. The relief association also provided a large portion of the funds used to re-acquire the 1936 Ford Pumper Truck in 2004. For the past three years, the group has also sponsored a "Breakfast with Santa" for the children in the area.
