RE: 2023 MAFD Budget

SUMMARY

The City Council will review the preliminary 2023 MAFD budget. The budget must be sent to contracted cities and townships no later than February 1, 2022.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

Attached is the preliminary 2023 MAFD budget. As of now, the combined budget and CIP will be a decrease of 2.83% from the 2022 budget. Below is a list of items that have the biggest change from the 2022 approved budget:

Expenditures

- A decrease in wages and salaries
- An increase to uniforms
- A decrease to repair and maintenance expenses
- An increase in worker's compensation insurance, assuming an increase in premiums for first responders
- An increase in bad debts/NSF checks and dues/subscriptions

Revenues

- No change in Fire Protection/Calls from 2022 budget
- A decrease in interest earnings, based on past year actuals
- A decrease in dividends, based on a recommendation from League of MN Cities to exclude dividends from budgets going forward due to their volatile nature
- Transfer from Capital Projects Fund includes \$17,950 to transfer funds already earmarked for the thermal camera replacement, turnout gear, and hose.

Capital Improvement Plan (CIP)

- Thermal Camera Replacement \$7,500 (in Capital Outlay line item)
- Turnout Gear \$7,500 (in Uniforms line item)
- Pagers \$2,080 (in Small Tools & Equipment line item)
- 5" hose \$1,500 (in Small Tools & Equipment line item)
- 1.75" Hose \$1,000 (in Small Tools & Equipment line item)
- 2.5" hose \$450 (in Small Tools & Equipment line item)

Memorandum

It is staff's intention to take suggestions from the council and bring the final 2023 MAFD budget for consideration on the regularly-scheduled meeting on January 18, 2022. The final budget must be sent to contracted cities and townships no later than February 1, 2022.

OPTIONS & IMPACTS

- 1. Review and edit the 2023 preliminary MAFD budget.
 - a. Suggest areas and/or projects that could be increased or decreased for 2023. Increasing line items increases the preliminary budget. Decreasing line items does not eliminate them from future budget years. Rather, it puts more burden on future budget years and may result in a larger increase in the future.
- 2. Review and recommend approval of the 2023 MAFD preliminary budget.
 - b. Formal approval must occur no later than the January 18, 2022 City Council meeting in order for staff to distribute the budget to contracted cities and townships before the deadline.

RECOMMENDATIONS

Review the preliminary budget, and direct staff appropriately.
