

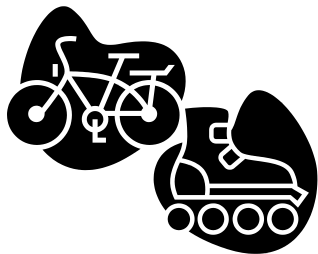
Trail System

The city has constructed and maintains approximately 4.3 miles of paved, multi-use trail which extends from the Kanabec History Center north to Trailview Elementary School, east across Highway 65 to the Spring Lake area and south to Maple Avenue East.

The City of Mora Park Board has identified three additional sections of trail to be added to the system which will ultimately create a looped trail system.

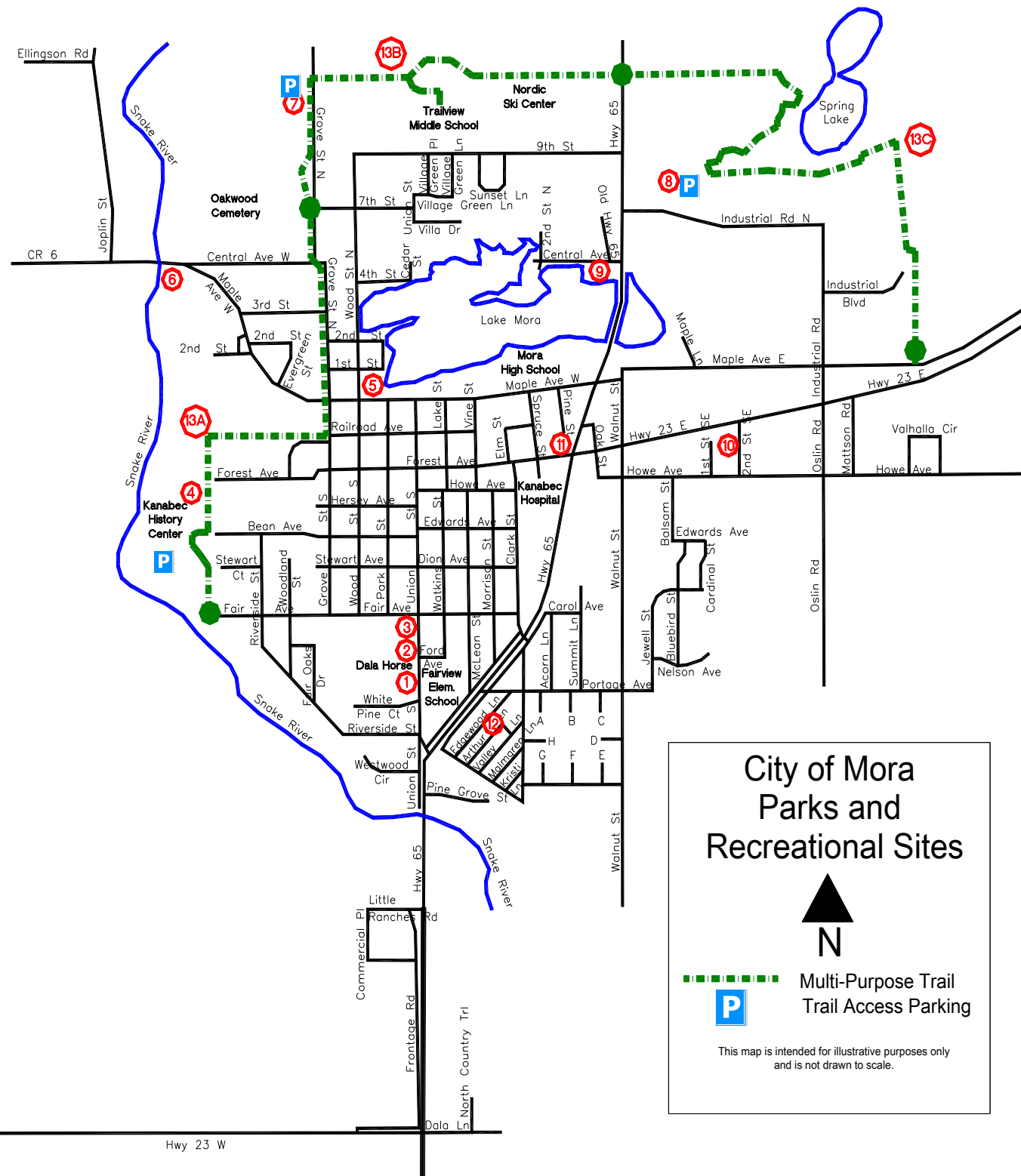

1. **Lion's Park / Kids Kingdom** – play equipment, grills and picnic shelter.
2. **Mora Aquatic Center** – open June through August, the Mora Aquatic Center offers a heated public pool, zero-depth pool, water slides and concessions.
3. **Skateboard and Bike Parks** – skateboard and bike ramps.
4. **Kanabec History Center** – museum, reference library, gift shop, farm machinery exhibit, covered picnic area and hiking & skiing trails along the river.
5. **Library Park** – play equipment, swings, basketball court, sand volleyball court, tennis court, picnic shelter and gazebo.
6. **Canoe Park** – picnic table overlooking the banks of the Snake River with ample parking and access for canoes.
7. **Jaycee's Park** – softball fields and children's play equipment.
8. **Keystone Park** – undeveloped park offering picnic area, scenic views of Spring Lake and access to the city's multi-purpose trail (access park from Industrial Road North).
9. **Peterson Park** – picnic area overlooking Lake Mora.
10. **Sunrise Park** – grill and picnic shelter.
11. **Ole Park** – site of "Ole", a skier statue, the sister city monument with Mora, Sweden, display of flags, grill and picnic table.
12. **Oak Park** – play equipment and basketball hoop.
13. **Multi-Purpose Trail** – approximately 4.3 miles of paved multi-use trail (see reverse side for more details).
